#### **Outreach Demonstration Events**

The investigators for the High School 2 Health Care (HS2HC) Science Education Partnership Award (SEPA) grant have conducted outreach activities in the community and outside of the state of Tennessee as well. Dr. Keisha Burnett arranged an outreach session with Ms. Kari Hughes, a classroom science teacher at Selmer Middle School, and her class on June 22, 2023. During this session, Dr. Keisha Burnett, a lab scientist, explained her role and the importance of cytology in the field of health. Specifically, she discussed how cytology plays a crucial role in diagnosing and monitoring oral cavity cancer, also known as oral or mouth cancer.

Dr. Burnett explained various cell collection methods, particularly from the oral cavity. One of the activities during this outreach involved the students collecting their own cheek cells, which is a common method used in cytology for cell collection.

Additionally, Dr. Burnett prepared several steps for staining and cell collection procedures and provided microscopes so that the students could examine their own cheek cells under the microscope. This hands-on experience likely allowed the students to see the importance of cytology in action and gain a better understanding of how it is used in diagnosing and monitoring diseases like oral cancer.







The UT Martin Selmer Center Coon Creek STEM Science Camp on July 13th featured presentations by two High School 2 Health Care (HS2HC) SEPA Principal Investigators. Dr. Keisha Burnett (with the assistance of Chelsea Peeler, Instructor, Master of Cytopathology Practice program at The University of Tennessee Health Science Center) discussed the importance of cytology in diagnosing and monitoring disease. Dr. Burnett explained various cell collection methods such as brushing, scraping, or fine needle aspiration. Dr. Burnett, along with Ms. Peeler, guided students through the staining and cell collection procedure, and they provided high-end microscopes to allow students to observe their cheek cells under a microscope. Dr. Taylor, A SEPA PI and Education Coordinator, contributed to

the camp by presenting a problem-based learning (PBL) scenario on Yellow Fever. After the short discussion activity, the students engaged in an activity related to the cycle of disease transmission. It's great to see such engaging and educational activities for young participants aged 8-13 years old at the camp!








### **Introduction to Cytology of the Oral Cavity:**






The SEPA team has provided information about the future SEPA Summer Camp to the public. Here's a summary of the information Dr. Simpfronia Taylor has shared:

- A short talk was presented at the Lauderdale Health Council and the UTM Ripley Center Board Meeting in May of the same year.




- The Lauderdale County Health Fair/Community Outreach event was held Saturday, October 28th at Ripley Elementary School.
